Ensemble Policies

1. GOALS: Most importantly, we will come up with our own goals as a group. Here are some examples:

- Enjoy singing
- Always participate
- Allow your soul a rest from the day's drama
- Maintain vocal health
- Sing a wide variety of music
- Focus
- Have patience
- Work as a team
- Extend vocal range
- Improve at sight-reading

This just barely touches the surface of the expectations you should have for yourself in order to be successful and proud of your work in chorus!

2. Ms. Godfrey's Expectations:

- You should be in class and **in your assigned seat by the time the bell rings with your folder (which includes paper and pencil)**. Backpacks and other belongings should be left on the left side of the room as you enter.
- We will follow the attendance policies designated by the school. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class period. If you are late, you will need to walk around to the back door to be admitted to class. After three unexcused tardies you will face the consequences set in place by GMHS. **You are considered tardy if you are not in your seat on the risers when the bell rings.**
- Food, drink, and gum will NOT be allowed in the chorus room. We want to keep the room we are so blessed with in great condition for all choral students. This rule is implemented for the sake of rehearsing in a healthy manner without distractions. Water bottles are certainly allowed and strongly encouraged.
- I trust that you all can take care of personal business before class time. **The restrooms will not be used during rehearsals** with the exception of emergencies (which will be at the discretion of the director).
- Absences from concerts will only be excused by the following:
 - Medical emergency
 - Family emergencyA parent will need to communicate these situations to Ms. Godfrey **BEFORE** the concert.
- **ALWAYS** be respectful to yourself, your classmates, and the director.

Choral Music Objectives

Throughout the course of the school year, choral students will strengthen their skills in the following areas:

1. Count and perform rhythms in simple and compound meters
2. Identify notes on the staff in treble and bass clefs
3. Identify solfege syllables in an exercise when given “do”
4. Perform a major scale using solfege syllables & hand signs and with numbers
5. Perform sight reading exercises with others (in unison, in 2 parts, etc.)
6. Perform a variety of music in a historically and stylistically correct manner
7. Have a working musical vocabulary including, but not limited to vocabulary related to rhythm, notation, dynamics, and tempo
8. Exemplify proper choral technique with regard to posture and vocal production

Assessments (formal and informal) will be given throughout the year in order to see how students are growing.

Formal assessments:

Mid-term exam (written)
Final exam (written **OR** solo performance)
Winter and Spring concerts

Informal assessments:

Small group sightreading quizzes
Folder checks
Music critiques in class (written)

Grading Policy

Students will be graded on the following:

- Classwork (50%) – positive engagement, exemplifying learned skills, working collaboratively, informal assessments, etc.
- Performances (20%) – two formal concerts, one school day field trip in spring (more information to come at a later date)
- Tests (20%) – formal assessments
- Homework (10%) – signed parent forms

Concert Attire

The GMHS Choral Department has been seen as a formal fine arts department for many decades. Students are asked to sing collegiate level music and therefore deserve to feel as though they are performing at the collegiate level. Our concert attire is **required** so that all students performing together feel a part of our successful groups.

Ladies:

Ladies' dresses will be ordered for incoming freshman, new members, or current members who need to purchase a new dress. Each choral ensemble will have the same dress so that a student may keep her dress throughout her four years in the program. The dresses are black, floor length and washable. The cost is **\$80.00, which includes hemming**. If in need of financial support, please see Ms. Godfrey *privately*. There are a *few* used dresses being sold at a discounted price.

Ladies' shoes should be very plain, low heel (no more than 1.5 in. heel) black shoes. No open toes, no sandals, no straps, no laces, no buckles, nothing shiny, etc.

Performance jewelry policy: for all formal performances students will wear only the jewelry required as part of the chorus outfit. **Die Meistersingers ladies are required to purchase the pearl/earring necklace set through the dress company for \$12.00.** I will send home more information on this soon. Ladies and gentlemen may wear stud earrings – no hoops. Ladies should not wear wristwatches or bracelets.

Gentlemen:

Die Meistersingers will continue to wear the traditional tuxedos. **Beginning Ensemble** and **Intermediate Ensemble** will have the same tuxedos, **minus** the jackets. New gentlemen will receive information regarding purchasing this attire. Uniforms for beginning men are **\$78.00** and tux coats for DM are **\$80.00**. The tuxedo company we work with, *Savvi Formalwear*, offers free alterations every year for our male chorus members. Therefore, if you grow from one year to the next, your tuxedo will be altered free of charge! Gentlemen, you **MUST** wear black socks and black dress shoes!

Obligation/Fair Share

The 2014-2015 choral music Obligation/Fair Share is the amount per student it takes to meet the Choral Booster Budget for the entire school year. The state does not fully fund our needs as a fine arts department and therefore this budget is necessary in order to provide quality experiences for every choral student at GMHS. This year's Fair Share is **\$80.00** per student. This budget goes towards needs such as: bus drivers, activity buses, music copies, folders, equipment, professional development for the director, space rental for concerts, accompanist fees, etc.

Thankfully, students are offered MANY opportunities to earn their entire obligation through fundraisers, or they may pay it all at the beginning of the year. Students will be credited all of their individual profits from each fundraiser in which they choose to participate until they have reached \$80.00 and their balance is \$0.00.

Once students have fulfilled their obligations, they may continue to fundraise if they wish. These funds can help toward individual trips (Intermediate and Die Meistersingers, or future trips for Beginning students). For students continuing in the Choral Program year to year, student account balances will carry over from year to year.

Our fundraisers for the school year are:

- Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser at Aversboro Restaurant (students sell tickets)
- Fruit Fundraiser
- Christmas Tree/Wreaths Fundraiser

*Information will be sent home with students at the kick-off of EACH fundraiser.

Students should be responsible for meeting their own obligations. This program is designed so that no student should have to pay out of his or her own pockets, nor should parents have to financially subsidize their child's choral experience. No fundraiser is mandatory. A student or parent may pay an obligation.

The best way to accumulate the most profit is through PATRONS. Students will receive 100% of patron monies toward the fulfillment of their obligations. Attached you will find one patron form for your use. Extras are made available at the student's request. All patron donations are tax deductible.

Obligation/Fair Share accounts for every student should be fulfilled by December 5, 2014.

All transactions through the Booster Club should be made by check so that there is a traceable record of every transaction. Please always write your child's name in the "memo line" of your checks. Checks should always be made payable to: GMHS Choral Boosters.
